- Yossi Beilin is a leading voice in Israel's peace camp and Israel-diaspora relations. A celebrated public thinker and former Member of Knesset, Beilin has held several key Israel government posts and ministerial offices. He was instrumental in the development of the Oslo Accords (1992-95), a framework agreement to end the Israeli-Palestinian conflict. His eleven books include *The Path to Geneva: The Quest for a Permanent Agreement* (2004) and *His Brother's Keeper: Israel and Diaspora Jewry in the Twenty-First Century* (2000). Beilin is depositing his personal papers and records in the Yad Tabenkin archives.
- Maggie Bar-Tura, translator of Amos Oz's In the Land of Israel (1993) and The Slopes of Lebanon (2012), is past secretary general of the Israel Movement for Progressive Judaism. She works with non-profits and social change start-ups in Israel and the USA.
