Yossi Beilin, founder, chairman of the board, and president of Beilink International Affairs Ltd., a private international consultancy and strategic investment firm, is a celebrated public thinker and a leading voice in Israel's peace camp and Israel-diaspora relations.

Beilin previously served as Israel's Minister of Justice (1991-2001), Minister of Religious Affairs (2000-2001), Minister of Economy and Planning (1995), Deputy Foreign Minister (1992-1995), and Deputy Finance Minister (1988-1990). A former Member of Knesset for the Labor Party (1988-1999) and the Meretz-Yachad Party (2006-2008), including Meretz-Yachad Party chairman (2004-2008), he served on the Knesset committees on Constitution, Law and Justice; Foreign Relations and Defense; and the Advancement of the Status of Women. He was instrumental in the development of the Oslo Accords (1992-95), a framework agreement to end the Israeli-Palestinian conflict.

Beilin holds a PhD in political science. A prolific author, his eleven books include *The Path to Geneva: The Quest for a Permanent Agreement* (2004), *His Brother's Keeper: Israel and Diaspora Jewry in the Twenty-First Century* (2000), and *Touching Peace: From the Oslo Accord to a Final Agreement* (1999).
